SHIFT TO MODERN CLASSIFICATION

AS SCIENTIFIC UNDERSTANDING PROGRESSED, PARTICULARLY WITH THE ADVENT OF GENETICS AND MOLECULAR BIOLOGY, THE LINNAEAN SYSTEM UNDERWENT REVISIONS. THE DISCOVERY OF MICROORGANISMS AND THEIR COMPLEXITY LED TO THE RECOGNITION THAT SOME INITIAL CLASSIFICATIONS DID NOT ADEQUATELY REPRESENT THE DIVERSITY OF LIFE.

THIS EVOLUTION RESULTED IN THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE FIVE-KINGDOM SYSTEM, WHICH WAS WIDELY ACCEPTED IN THE 1960S AND 1970S. FURTHER ADVANCEMENTS IN MOLECULAR TECHNIQUES EVENTUALLY LED TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE THREE-DOMAIN SYSTEM, CATEGORIZING LIFE INTO BACTERIA, ARCHAEA, AND EUKARYA.

THE FIVE KINGDOMS OF LIFE

THE FIVE KINGDOMS OF LIFE SERVE AS A FRAMEWORK FOR UNDERSTANDING THE VAST DIVERSITY OF ORGANISMS ON EARTH. EACH KINGDOM IS DEFINED BY SPECIFIC CHARACTERISTICS THAT DIFFERENTIATE IT FROM THE OTHERS.

1. KINGDOM MONERA

- CHARACTERISTICS: MOSTLY UNICELLULAR, EUKARYOTIC, AND CAN BE AUTOTROPHIC OR HETEROTROPHIC.
- EXAMPLES: AMOEBA, PARAMECIUM, AND ALGAE.

3. KINGDOM FUNGI

FUNGI ARE PRIMARILY MULTICELLULAR EUKARYOTIC ORGANISMS THAT ABSORB NUTRIENTS FROM THEIR ENVIRONMENT.

- CHARACTERISTICS: CELL WALLS MADE OF CHITIN, HETEROTROPHIC THROUGH ABSORPTION, AND REPRODUCE VIA SPORES.

- EXAMPLES: MUSHROOMS, YEASTS, AND MOLDS.

4. KINGDOM PLANTAE

PLANTAE INCLUDES MULTICELLULAR, AUTOTROPHIC ORGANISMS THAT PERFORM PHOTOSYNTHESIS.

- CHARACTERISTICS: CELL WALLS MADE OF CELLULOSE, POSSESS CHLOROPHYLL, AND REPRODUCE VIA SEEDS OR SPORES.
- EXAMPLES: FERNS, FLOWERING PLANTS, AND CONIFERS.

5. KINGDOM ANIMALIA

ANIMALIA ENCOMPASSES MULTICELLULAR, HETEROTROPHIC ORGANISMS THAT TYPICALLY HAVE COMPLEX STRUCTURES.

- CHARACTERISTICS: NO CELL WALLS, CAPABLE OF MOVEMENT, AND REPRODUCE SEXUALLY OR ASEXUALLY.
- EXAMPLES: MAMMALS, BIRDS, REPTILES, AND INSECTS.

MODERN TAXONOMY: THE THREE DOMAINS

WITH ADVANCEMENTS IN GENETIC RESEARCH, THE TRADITIONAL FIVE-KINGDOM SYSTEM HAS BEEN EXPANDED INTO A THREE-DOMAIN SYSTEM, WHICH CATEGORIZES ALL LIFE INTO BACTERIA, ARCHAEA, AND EUKARYA.

DOMAIN BACTERIA

THIS DOMAIN INCLUDES ALL PROKARYOTIC CELLS THAT ARE CLASSIFIED UNDER THE KINGDOM MONERA.

- CHARACTERISTICS: UNICELLULAR, LACK MEMBRANE-BOUND ORGANELLES, AND HAVE PEPTIDOGLYCAN IN THEIR CELL WALLS.
- EXAMPLES: CYANOBACTERIA, PATHOGENIC BACTERIA.

DOMAIN ARCHAEA

ARCHAEA ALSO CONSIST OF PROKARYOTIC ORGANISMS BUT ARE STRUCTURALLY AND GENETICALLY DISTINCT FROM BACTERIA.

- CHARACTERISTICS: OFTEN EXTREMOPHILES, WITH UNIQUE BIOCHEMISTRY AND MEMBRANE LIPIDS.

- EXAMPLES: METHANOGENS, HALOPHILES.

DOMAIN EUKARYA

THIS DOMAIN INCLUDES ALL EUKARYOTIC ORGANISMS, WHICH ARE CATEGORIZED INTO THE KINGDOMS PROTISTA, FUNGI, PLANTAE, AND ANIMALIA.

- CHARACTERISTICS: COMPLEX CELLS WITH MEMBRANE-BOUND ORGANELLES AND A DEFINED NUCLEUS.
- EXAMPLES: PROTISTS LIKE ALGAE, FUNGI LIKE YEAST, PLANTS LIKE OAK TREES, AND ANIMALS LIKE HUMANS.
