

PLAQUE BIOLOGY

CONVERSELY, CERTAIN PLAQUES IN THE BRAIN MAY PLAY ROLES IN NORMAL CELLULAR PROCESSES. UNDERSTANDING THE NUANCES OF PLAQUE BIOLOGY IS ESSENTIAL FOR DEVELOPING TARGETED THERAPIES AND INTERVENTIONS.

TYPES OF PLAQUES

FORMATION MECHANISMS

4. **FIBROUS CAP FORMATION:** OVER TIME, SMOOTH MUSCLE CELLS MIGRATE TO THE SITE, FORMING A FIBROUS CAP OVER THE LIPID CORE, LEADING TO PLAQUE STABILITY OR INSTABILITY.

AMYLOID PLAQUE FORMATION

AMYLOID PLAQUES ARISE PRIMARILY FROM THE ABNORMAL PROCESSING OF AMYLOID PRECURSOR PROTEIN (APP). THE KEY MECHANISMS INVOLVED INCLUDE:

- **ENZYMATIC CLEAVAGE:** APP IS CLEAVED BY BETA-SECRETASE AND GAMMA-SECRETASE, RESULTING IN THE PRODUCTION OF BETA-AMYLOID PEPTIDES.
- **AGGREGATION:** THESE PEPTIDES CAN AGGREGATE INTO OLIGOMERS AND FIBRILS, EVENTUALLY FORMING INSOLUBLE AMYLOID PLAQUES.
- **TOXICITY:** THE ACCUMULATION OF THESE PLAQUES IS BELIEVED TO CONTRIBUTE TO NEUROTOXICITY AND SYNAPTIC DYSFUNCTION IN NEURONS.

DENTAL PLAQUE FORMATION

DENTAL PLAQUE FORMATION IS A BIOLOGICAL PROCESS THAT BEGINS SHORTLY AFTER EATING. THE STEPS INVOLVED INCLUDE:

1. PELLICLE FORMATION: SALIVARY PROTEINS CREATE A THIN FILM ON THE TOOTH SURFACE.

3. BIOFILM DEVELOPMENT: AS BACTERIA PROLIFERATE, THEY PRODUCE EXTRACELLULAR POLYSACCHARIDES, LEADING TO THE FORMATION OF A COMPLEX BIOFILM.

BIOLOGICAL IMPLICATIONS OF PLAQUES
