UNDERSTANDING ASSOCIATE IN CHEMISTRY JOBS

LABORATORY TECHNICIAN

ENVIRONMENTAL TECHNICIAN

- COLLECTING ENVIRONMENTAL SAMPLES, SUCH AS WATER AND SOIL.
- TESTING FOR POLLUTANTS AND CONTAMINANTS.
- ASSISTING IN ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENTS.

PHARMACEUTICAL SALES REPRESENTATIVE

- BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS WITH PHYSICIANS AND PHARMACISTS.
- STAYING INFORMED ABOUT THE LATEST ADVANCEMENTS IN PHARMACEUTICALS.

ESSENTIAL SKILLS FOR SUCCESS

POTENTIAL EMPLOYERS

CHEMISTRY GRADUATES CAN FIND EMPLOYMENT IN A VARIETY OF SETTINGS. SOME OF THE MAJOR EMPLOYERS INCLUDE:

- PHARMACEUTICAL COMPANIES, WHERE RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT IS KEY.
- ENVIRONMENTAL AGENCIES FOCUSED ON MONITORING AND PROTECTING NATURAL RESOURCES.
- ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS, INCLUDING UNIVERSITIES AND RESEARCH LABORATORIES.
- MANUFACTURING FIRMS THAT REQUIRE QUALITY CONTROL AND ASSURANCE.
- GOVERNMENT AGENCIES INVOLVED IN HEALTH, SAFETY, AND REGULATIONS.

GAINING EXPERIENCE

INTERNSHIPS AND VOLUNTEER POSITIONS CAN PROVIDE PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE THAT ENHANCES A RESUME. MANY EMPLOYERS PREFER CANDIDATES WITH HANDS-ON EXPERIENCE, WHICH CAN BE GAINED THROUGH VARIOUS OPPORTUNITIES, INCLUDING:

- INTERNSHIPS IN RESEARCH LABORATORIES OR COMPANIES.
- PART-TIME POSITIONS IN QUALITY CONTROL OR ENVIRONMENTAL TESTING.
- VOLUNTEER WORK WITH ENVIRONMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS.
