WITH EACH SUCCESSIVE ELEMENT, A PROTON IS ADDED TO THE NUCLEUS AND AN ELECTRON TO THE OUTER SHELL, BUT THE INCREASED POSITIVE CHARGE IN THE NUCLEUS EXERTS A STRONGER ATTRACTIVE FORCE ON THE ELECTRONS, RESULTING IN A SMALLER ATOMIC RADIUS.

TRENDS DOWN A GROUP

CONVERSELY, AS ONE MOVES DOWN A GROUP IN THE PERIODIC TABLE, THE ATOMIC RADIUS INCREASES. THIS INCREASE IS ATTRIBUTED TO THE ADDITION OF ELECTRON SHELLS. EACH ROW IN THE PERIODIC TABLE CORRESPONDS TO A NEW ELECTRON SHELL BEING FILLED, WHICH OUTWEIGHS THE INCREASING POSITIVE CHARGE IN THE NUCLEUS. THEREFORE, WHILE THE NUCLEAR CHARGE DOES INCREASE, THE EFFECT OF ADDITIONAL ELECTRON SHELLS RESULTS IN A LARGER ATOMIC RADIUS.

- LEFT TO RIGHT: DECREASE IN ATOMIC RADIUS
- TOP TO BOTTOM: INCREASE IN ATOMIC RADIUS

ELECTRONEGATIVITY TRENDS

ELECTRONEGATIVITY IS THE TENDENCY OF AN ATOM TO ATTRACT ELECTRONS IN A CHEMICAL BOND. THIS PROPERTY IS CRITICAL IN UNDERSTANDING HOW ATOMS INTERACT AND FORM COMPOUNDS. ELECTRONEGATIVITY TRENDS ALSO EXHIBIT A CLEAR PATTERN ACROSS PERIODS AND GROUPS.

TRENDS ACROSS A PERIOD

CONSEQUENTLY, ELEMENTS LIKE CESIUM HAVE LOW ELECTRONEGATIVITY COMPARED TO ELEMENTS LIKE FLUORINE.

- LEFT TO RIGHT: INCREASE IN ELECTRONEGATIVITY
- TOP TO BOTTOM: DECREASE IN ELECTRONEGATIVITY

IONIZATION ENERGY TRENDS

IONIZATION ENERGY IS THE AMOUNT OF ENERGY REQUIRED TO REMOVE AN ELECTRON FROM AN ATOM. THIS PROPERTY PROVIDES INSIGHT INTO THE REACTIVITY OF ELEMENTS AND THEIR ABILITY TO FORM IONS. LIKE ATOMIC RADIUS AND ELECTRONEGATIVITY, IONIZATION ENERGY TRENDS FOLLOW PREDICTABLE PATTERNS.

TRENDS ACROSS A PERIOD

AS ONE MOVES FROM LEFT TO RIGHT ACROSS A PERIOD, IONIZATION ENERGY INCREASES. THE INCREASED ATOMIC RADIUS MEANS THAT THE OUTERMOST ELECTRONS ARE FARTHER FROM THE NUCLEUS AND EXPERIENCE GREATER SHIELDING FROM INNER ELECTRONS. AS A RESULT, LESS ENERGY IS REQUIRED TO REMOVE AN OUTER ELECTRON FROM ELEMENTS LIKE POTASSIUM COMPARED TO ELEMENTS HIGHER IN THE GROUP.

- LEFT TO RIGHT: INCREASE IN IONIZATION ENERGY
- TOP TO BOTTOM: DECREASE IN IONIZATION ENERGY

METALLIC AND NONMETALLIC CHARACTER TRENDS

THE METALLIC AND NONMETALLIC CHARACTER OF ELEMENTS IS ANOTHER CRUCIAL ASPECT OF CHEMISTRY TRENDS IN THE PERIODIC TABLE. THIS CHARACTER INFLUENCES THE TYPES OF BONDS THAT ELEMENTS CAN FORM AND THEIR OVERALL REACTIVITY IN CHEMICAL REACTIONS.

THE INCREASED ATOMIC SIZE AND THE ABILITY TO LOSE ELECTRONS MORE EASILY CONTRIBUTE TO THE RISE IN METALLIC CHARACTER AS ONE DESCENDS THE PERIODIC TABLE.

- LEFT TO RIGHT: DECREASE IN METALLIC CHARACTER

- TOP TO BOTTOM: INCREASE IN METALLIC CHARACTER
