PROTON TRANSFER

DURING THE REACTION, THERE MAY BE SEVERAL PROTON TRANSFER STEPS, WHICH HELP STABILIZE THE INTERMEDIATES. PROTON TRANSFERS CAN FACILITATE THE ELIMINATION OF THE SMALL MOLECULE, SUCH AS WATER, THUS DRIVING THE REACTION FORWARD.

ELIMINATION OF THE SMALL MOLECULE

THE FINAL STEP IN MOST CONDENSATION REACTIONS IS THE ELIMINATION OF THE SMALL MOLECULE. THIS STEP IS OFTEN WHAT DRIVES THE REACTION TO COMPLETION, AS THE REMOVAL OF WATER OR METHANOL SHIFTS THE EQUILIBRIUM TOWARDS THE FORMATION OF THE DESIRED PRODUCT.

APPLICATIONS IN ORGANIC SYNTHESIS
