

DIMER MEANING IN CHEMISTRY

DIMER MEANING IN CHEMISTRY REFERS TO A SPECIFIC TERM USED TO DESCRIBE A MOLECULE COMPOSED OF TWO IDENTICAL OR SIMILAR SUBUNITS. 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DEFINITION OF DIMER

THESE TYPES OF DIMERS EXHIBIT DIFFERENT STABILITY AND REACTIVITY DEPENDING ON THE NATURE OF THE BONDS AND THE

ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS, MAKING THEM A VERSATILE TOPIC OF STUDY IN CHEMISTRY.

FORMATION OF DIMERS
