TYPES OF FILTRATION TECHNIQUES

THIS METHOD IS PARTICULARLY USEFUL FOR FILTERING LARGE VOLUMES OF LIQUID OR FOR COLLECTING SOLIDS QUICKLY. VACUUM FILTRATION SETUPS TYPICALLY INCLUDE A BÜchner FUNNEL AND A VACUUM SOURCE.

3. MICROFILTRATION

MICROFILTRATION UTILIZES MEMBRANES WITH PORE SIZES RANGING FROM 0.1 TO 10 MICRONS. THIS TECHNIQUE IS EFFECTIVE IN REMOVING LARGER PARTICLES, BACTERIA, AND SOME VIRUSES FROM LIQUIDS. IT IS WIDELY USED IN THE FOOD AND BEVERAGE INDUSTRY, AS WELL AS IN WATER TREATMENT PROCESSES.

4. ULTRAFILTRATION

ULTRAFILTRATION EMPLOYS MEMBRANES WITH SMALLER PORE SIZES (1–100 NANOMETERS) TO SEPARATE MACROMOLECULES, COLLOIDS, AND PROTEINS FROM SOLUTIONS. THIS TECHNIQUE IS ESSENTIAL IN BIOCHEMICAL APPLICATIONS, SUCH AS PROTEIN PURIFICATION AND CONCENTRATION.

5. NANOFILTRATION

NANOFILTRATION IS A PRESSURE-DRIVEN PROCESS THAT OPERATES AT THE NANOMETER SCALE. IT CAN SELECTIVELY REMOVE DIVALENT AND LARGER MONOVALENT IONS WHILE ALLOWING SMALLER IONS TO PASS THROUGH. THIS TECHNIQUE IS OFTEN APPLIED IN WATER SOFTENING AND SELECTIVE SEPARATION PROCESSES.

6. REVERSE OSMOSIS

REVERSE OSMOSIS IS A HIGHLY EFFICIENT FILTRATION METHOD THAT USES A SEMI-PERMEABLE MEMBRANE TO REMOVE A WIDE RANGE OF CONTAMINANTS, INCLUDING SALTS AND ORGANIC MOLECULES, FROM WATER. IT IS EXTENSIVELY USED IN DESALINATION AND WATER PURIFICATION SYSTEMS.

PRINCIPLES OF FILTRATION

THE PRINCIPLES OF FILTRATION TECHNIQUES REVOLVE AROUND THE SIZE, CHARGE, AND CHEMICAL PROPERTIES OF THE PARTICLES BEING SEPARATED. ADSORPTION

PRESSURE-DRIVEN FILTRATION

PRESSURE-DRIVEN FILTRATION METHODS, SUCH AS ULTRAFILTRATION AND REVERSE OSMOSIS, RELY ON APPLYING PRESSURE TO OVERCOME OSMOTIC PRESSURE. THIS ENSURES THAT WATER AND SMALLER SOLUTES PASS THROUGH THE MEMBRANE WHILE LARGER PARTICLES ARE RETAINED.
