- **APPLICATIONS:** GC IS WIDELY USED FOR ANALYZING VOLATILE ORGANIC COMPOUNDS (VOCs) IN ENVIRONMENTAL SAMPLES, TESTING PURITY IN PHARMACEUTICALS, AND IN FORENSIC SCIENCE.
- **ADVANTAGES:** HIGH RESOLUTION, SPEED, AND SENSITIVITY MAKE GC A PREFERRED CHOICE FOR MANY APPLICATIONS.

LIQUID CHROMATOGRAPHY (LC)

LIQUID CHROMATOGRAPHY IS SIMILAR TO GC BUT USES A LIQUID MOBILE PHASE. IT IS PARTICULARLY EFFECTIVE FOR NON-VOLATILE AND LARGER MOLECULES. HIGH-PERFORMANCE LIQUID CHROMATOGRAPHY (HPLC) IS A COMMON VARIANT THAT EMPLOYS HIGH PRESSURE TO ENHANCE SEPARATION EFFICIENCY.

THIN-LAYER CHROMATOGRAPHY (TLC)

A THIN LAYER OF STATIONARY PHASE, TYPICALLY SILICA GEL, IS APPLIED TO A PLATE, AND THE SAMPLE IS SPOTTED ONTO THE SURFACE. THE PLATE IS THEN DEVELOPED IN A SOLVENT, ALLOWING COMPONENTS TO MOVE AT DIFFERENT RATES.

- **APPLICATIONS:** TLC IS OFTEN USED FOR MONITORING REACTION PROGRESS, CHECKING THE PURITY OF COMPOUNDS, AND IDENTIFYING SUBSTANCES BY COMPARISON WITH STANDARDS.
- **ADVANTAGES:** MINIMAL EQUIPMENT IS REQUIRED, AND RESULTS CAN BE VISUALIZED EASILY USING UV LIGHT OR STAINING METHODS.

SPECTROSCOPY METHODS

SPECTROSCOPY ENCOMPASSES VARIOUS TECHNIQUES USED TO ANALYZE THE INTERACTION BETWEEN MATTER AND ELECTROMAGNETIC RADIATION. INFRARED (IR) SPECTROSCOPY

MASS SPECTROMETRY (MS)

STEAM DISTILLATION

REDOX TITRATION
