CHROMATOGRAPHY

CHROMATOGRAPHY IS ONE OF THE MOST WIDELY USED LABORATORY TECHNIQUES ORGANIC CHEMISTRY EMPLOYS FOR THE SEPARATION AND ANALYSIS OF COMPONENTS IN A MIXTURE. TYPES OF CHROMATOGRAPHY

EACH TYPE OF CHROMATOGRAPHY SERVES A UNIQUE PURPOSE AND IS CHOSEN BASED ON THE PHYSICAL AND CHEMICAL PROPERTIES OF THE COMPOUNDS BEING ANALYZED:

- **GAS CHROMATOGRAPHY (GC):** UTILIZES A GASEOUS MOBILE PHASE TO SEPARATE VOLATILE COMPOUNDS. IT IS HIGHLY EFFECTIVE FOR ANALYZING SUBSTANCES THAT CAN VAPORIZE WITHOUT DECOMPOSITION.
- **LIQUID CHROMATOGRAPHY (LC):** INVOLVES A LIQUID MOBILE PHASE AND IS SUITABLE FOR SEPARATING A WIDE RANGE OF ORGANIC COMPOUNDS, INCLUDING LARGE BIOMOLECULES.
- **THIN-LAYER CHROMATOGRAPHY (TLC):** A SIMPLE AND QUICK METHOD USING A THIN LAYER OF ADSORBENT ON A PLATE. IT IS OFTEN USED FOR MONITORING THE PROGRESS OF REACTIONS.

IN CHROMATOGRAPHY, THE CHOICE OF STATIONARY AND MOBILE PHASES IS CRITICAL TO ACHIEVING OPTIMAL SEPARATION. FACTORS SUCH AS POLARITY, MOLECULAR WEIGHT, AND SOLUBILITY INFLUENCE THE EFFICIENCY OF THE SEPARATION PROCESS.

SPECTROSCOPY

SPECTROSCOPY IS ANOTHER VITAL TECHNIQUE IN LABORATORY TECHNIQUES ORGANIC CHEMISTRY, PROVIDING INSIGHTS INTO THE MOLECULAR STRUCTURE AND COMPOSITION OF ORGANIC COMPOUNDS. TITRATION TECHNIQUES

TITRATION IS A QUANTITATIVE ANALYTICAL TECHNIQUE USED TO DETERMINE THE CONCENTRATION OF A SOLUTE IN A SOLUTION. IN ORGANIC CHEMISTRY, TITRATIONS CAN BE EMPLOYED TO ASSESS THE PURITY OF COMPOUNDS OR TO ANALYZE REACTION PROGRESS.

TYPES OF TITRATION
