THIS ARRANGEMENT IS A RESULT OF THE RESONANCE STRUCTURES THAT CAN BE DRAWN FOR THE NITRATE ION, WHICH SHOW THE DELOCALIZATION OF ELECTRONS AMONG THE OXYGEN ATOMS.

PHYSICAL PROPERTIES

NITRATES ARE TYPICALLY FOUND AS WHITE CRYSTALLINE SOLIDS IN THEIR PURE FORM AND ARE HIGHLY SOLUBLE IN WATER. THE SOLUBILITY AND STABILITY OF NITRATES MAKE THEM WIDELY USED IN VARIOUS APPLICATIONS. SOME KEY PHYSICAL PROPERTIES INCLUDE:

NITRATE POLLUTION

INDUSTRIAL APPLICATIONS OF NITRATE

NITRATES IN AGRICULTURE
