

# NOBEL PRIZE IN CHEMISTRY 2011

## OVERVIEW OF THE NOBEL PRIZE IN CHEMISTRY

## 2011 NOBEL LAUREATE: DAN SCHECHTMAN

DAN SCHECHTMAN, AN ISRAELI SCIENTIST, RECEIVED THE NOBEL PRIZE IN CHEMISTRY IN 2011 FOR HIS DISCOVERY OF QUASICRYSTALS. HIS JOURNEY BEGAN IN THE EARLY 1980S WHEN HE WAS CONDUCTING RESEARCH AT THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF STANDARDS AND TECHNOLOGY IN THE UNITED STATES. DURING HIS EXPERIMENTS, SCHECHTMAN OBSERVED AN UNUSUAL PATTERN IN THE DIFFRACTION OF ALUMINUM AND MANGANESE, WHICH CONTRADICTED THE ACCEPTED UNDERSTANDING OF CRYSTAL STRUCTURES.

AT THE TIME, THE SCIENTIFIC COMMUNITY WAS LARGELY SKEPTICAL OF HIS FINDINGS. TRADITIONAL CRYSTALLOGRAPHY DICTATED THAT CRYSTALS MUST EXHIBIT PERIODIC STRUCTURES. HOWEVER, SCHECHTMAN'S DISCOVERY OF APERIODIC ORDER IN THE ARRANGEMENT OF ATOMS WAS REVOLUTIONARY. HE FACED SIGNIFICANT RESISTANCE, BUT HIS PERSISTENCE AND DEDICATION TO HIS WORK ULTIMATELY LED TO THE WIDESPREAD ACCEPTANCE OF QUASICRYSTALS AS A LEGITIMATE CLASS OF MATERIALS.

## BIOGRAPHICAL BACKGROUND

DAN SCHECHTMAN WAS BORN ON JANUARY 24, 1941, IN TEL AVIV, ISRAEL. HE PURSUED HIS EDUCATION IN ENGINEERING AND MATERIALS SCIENCE, EARNING A DEGREE FROM THE TECHNION – ISRAEL INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY. SCHECHTMAN'S CAREER HAS SPANNED SEVERAL DECADES, DURING WHICH HE HAS HELD VARIOUS ACADEMIC AND RESEARCH POSITIONS, CONTRIBUTING SIGNIFICANTLY TO THE FIELDS OF MATERIALS SCIENCE AND CRYSTALLOGRAPHY. ## APPLICATIONS OF QUASICRYSTALS

## FUTURE RESEARCH DIRECTIONS
