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INTRODUCTION TO OLIVE OIL CHEMISTRY

VARIETAL DIFFERENCES IN OLIVE OIL

DIFFERENT OLIVE VARIETIES YIELD OILS WITH DISTINCT FLAVORS AND CHEMICAL COMPOSITIONS. THE GENETIC MAKEUP OF THE OLIVE TREE, ALONG WITH ENVIRONMENTAL FACTORS SUCH AS SOIL TYPE AND CLIMATE, INFLUENCES THE OIL'S CHARACTERISTICS.

COMMON OLIVE VARIETIES
