CATIONS FROM THE SALT BRIDGE MIGRATE TOWARD THE CATHODE, WHERE THEY NEUTRALIZE THE EXCESS NEGATIVE CHARGE, WHILE ANIONS MOVE TOWARD THE ANODE. THIS IONIC MOVEMENT ALLOWS FOR CONTINUOUS ELECTRON FLOW THROUGH THE EXTERNAL CIRCUIT, SUSTAINING THE ELECTROCHEMICAL REACTION.
