NUCLEAR MAGNETIC RESONANCE (NMR) SPECTROSCOPY

- **CARBON-13 NMR (^{13}C NMR):** TARGETS CARBON ATOMS, USEFUL FOR DETERMINING THE CARBON FRAMEWORK OF ORGANIC COMPOUNDS.

ULTRAVIOLET-VISIBLE (UV-VIS) SPECTROSCOPY

UV-VIS SPECTROSCOPY MEASURES THE ABSORPTION OF ULTRAVIOLET AND VISIBLE LIGHT BY A SAMPLE. MOLECULES ABSORB LIGHT AT SPECIFIC WAVELENGTHS, LEADING TO ELECTRONIC TRANSITIONS. THIS METHOD IS PARTICULARLY USEFUL FOR ANALYZING THE CONCENTRATIONS OF COLORED SOLUTIONS AND STUDYING ELECTRONIC STRUCTURES.

- **QUANTITATIVE ANALYSIS:** UV-VIS CAN DETERMINE THE CONCENTRATION OF SAMPLES USING BEER-LAMBERT LAW.
