

SUPRAMOLECULAR CHEMISTRY DEFINITION

HISTORY OF SUPRAMOLECULAR CHEMISTRY

THE TERM "SUPRAMOLECULAR CHEMISTRY" WAS FIRST COINED IN THE 1980s BY CHEMIST JEAN-MARIE LEHN, WHO WON THE NOBEL PRIZE IN CHEMISTRY IN 1987 FOR HIS CONTRIBUTIONS TO THIS FIELD. LEHN'S PIONEERING WORK FOCUSED ON THE DESIGN OF MOLECULAR SYSTEMS THAT EXHIBIT COMPLEX BEHAVIORS DUE TO THE INTERACTIONS BETWEEN THEIR CONSTITUENT PARTS. RESEARCHERS BEGAN TO INVESTIGATE HOW THESE ASSEMBLIES COULD BE USED TO CREATE NEW MATERIALS WITH UNIQUE PROPERTIES, LEADING TO SIGNIFICANT ADVANCEMENTS IN NANOTECHNOLOGY AND MATERIALS SCIENCE. - **VAN DER WAALS FORCES:** THESE ARE WEAK ATTRACTIONS BETWEEN MOLECULES DUE TO TRANSIENT DIPOLES THAT OCCUR WHEN ELECTRON DISTRIBUTIONS ARE UNEVEN. ALTHOUGH INDIVIDUALLY WEAK, VAN DER WAALS FORCES CAN COLLECTIVELY CONTRIBUTE TO THE STABILITY OF LARGER SUPRAMOLECULAR ASSEMBLIES.
- **IONIC INTERACTIONS:** THESE OCCUR BETWEEN CHARGED SPECIES AND ARE OFTEN STRONGER THAN HYDROGEN BONDS. IONIC INTERACTIONS CAN SIGNIFICANTLY INFLUENCE THE FORMATION OF SUPRAMOLECULAR STRUCTURES, ESPECIALLY IN AQUEOUS ENVIRONMENTS.
- **HYDROPHOBIC INTERACTIONS:** THESE INTERACTIONS OCCUR WHEN NON-POLAR MOLECULES AGGREGATE IN AN AQUEOUS ENVIRONMENT TO MINIMIZE THEIR EXPOSURE TO WATER. HYDROPHOBIC INTERACTIONS ARE FUNDAMENTAL TO THE SELF-ASSEMBLY OF LIPIDS AND PROTEINS.

APPLICATIONS OF SUPRAMOLECULAR CHEMISTRY
