SUSPENSION VS. OTHER MIXTURES

COLLOIDS

COLLOIDS ARE MIXTURES WHERE FINE PARTICLES ARE DISPERSED THROUGHOUT A CONTINUOUS MEDIUM, SIMILAR TO SUSPENSIONS BUT WITH SMALLER PARTICLE SIZES (BETWEEN 1 NANOMETER AND 1 MICROMETER). UNLIKE SUSPENSIONS, COLLOIDAL PARTICLES DO NOT SETTLE OUT OVER TIME, AND THEY CAN SCATTER LIGHT, LEADING TO A PHENOMENON KNOWN AS THE TYNDALL EFFECT. EXAMPLES OF COLLOIDS INCLUDE MILK AND FOG.
