WHAT IS THERMODYNAMICS?

TYPES OF THERMODYNAMIC SYSTEMS

- **OPEN SYSTEMS:** THESE SYSTEMS CAN EXCHANGE BOTH MATTER AND ENERGY WITH THEIR SURROUNDINGS, SUCH AS A BOILING POT OF WATER.
- **CLOSED SYSTEMS:** IN CLOSED SYSTEMS, ENERGY CAN BE EXCHANGED WITH THE SURROUNDINGS, BUT MATTER CANNOT, LIKE A SEALED CONTAINER OF GAS.

- **ISOLATED SYSTEMS:** THESE SYSTEMS DO NOT EXCHANGE EITHER MATTER OR ENERGY WITH THEIR SURROUNDINGS, SUCH AS A PERFECTLY INSULATED THERMOS.

THE LAWS OF THERMODYNAMICS

THE LAWS OF THERMODYNAMICS FORM THE FOUNDATION OF THIS FIELD, PROVIDING GUIDELINES THAT GOVERN ENERGY INTERACTIONS. THERE ARE FOUR PRIMARY LAWS, EACH WITH DISTINCT IMPLICATIONS FOR CHEMICAL PROCESSES AND ENERGY TRANSFER.

THE ZEROth LAW OF THERMODYNAMICS

THE ZEROth LAW ESTABLISHES THE CONCEPT OF TEMPERATURE AND THERMAL EQUILIBRIUM. IT STATES THAT IF TWO SYSTEMS ARE EACH IN THERMAL EQUILIBRIUM WITH A THIRD SYSTEM, THEY ARE IN THERMAL EQUILIBRIUM WITH EACH OTHER. THIS PRINCIPLE LAYS THE GROUNDWORK FOR TEMPERATURE MEASUREMENT AND HELPS DEFINE THERMAL STATES.

THE FIRST LAW OF THERMODYNAMICS

ALSO KNOWN AS THE LAW OF ENERGY CONSERVATION, THE FIRST LAW STATES THAT ENERGY CANNOT BE CREATED OR DESTROYED, ONLY TRANSFORMED FROM ONE FORM TO ANOTHER. IN A CLOSED SYSTEM, THE CHANGE IN INTERNAL ENERGY IS EQUAL TO THE HEAT ADDED TO THE SYSTEM MINUS THE WORK DONE BY THE SYSTEM. THIS LAW EMPHASIZES THE IMPORTANCE OF ENERGY CONSERVATION IN CHEMICAL REACTIONS AND PHYSICAL PROCESSES.

THE SECOND LAW OF THERMODYNAMICS

THE SECOND LAW INTRODUCES THE CONCEPT OF ENTROPY, WHICH MEASURES THE DEGREE OF DISORDER OR RANDOMNESS IN A SYSTEM. IT STATES THAT IN AN ISOLATED SYSTEM, ENTROPY WILL TEND TO INCREASE OVER TIME, LEADING TO IRREVERSIBLE PROCESSES. THIS PRINCIPLE EXPLAINS WHY ENERGY TRANSFORMATIONS ARE NOT 100% EFFICIENT, AS SOME ENERGY IS ALWAYS LOST TO DISORDER.

THE THIRD LAW OF THERMODYNAMICS

THE THIRD LAW STATES THAT AS THE TEMPERATURE OF A SYSTEM APPROACHES ABSOLUTE ZERO, THE ENTROPY OF A PERFECT CRYSTAL APPROACHES A CONSTANT MINIMUM. THIS LAW HAS PROFOUND IMPLICATIONS FOR UNDERSTANDING THE BEHAVIOR OF MATERIALS AT EXTREMELY LOW TEMPERATURES AND IS ESSENTIAL IN AREAS SUCH AS CRYOGENICS.

KEY CONCEPTS IN THERMODYNAMICS

TO GRASP THERMODYNAMICS, SEVERAL KEY CONCEPTS MUST BE UNDERSTOOD, INCLUDING ENTHALPY, GIBBS FREE ENERGY, AND HEAT CAPACITY.

ENTHALPY

ENTHALPY IS A THERMODYNAMIC QUANTITY THAT REPRESENTS THE TOTAL HEAT CONTENT OF A SYSTEM. IT IS PARTICULARLY USEFUL IN PROCESSES OCCURRING AT CONSTANT PRESSURE. THE CHANGE IN ENTHALPY (ΔH) DURING A REACTION INDICATES WHETHER THE PROCESS IS EXOTHERMIC (RELEASES HEAT) OR ENDOTHERMIC (ABSORBS HEAT).

GIBBS FREE ENERGY

GIBBS FREE ENERGY (G) COMBINES ENTHALPY AND ENTROPY TO DETERMINE THE SPONTANEITY OF A REACTION. THE GIBBS FREE ENERGY CHANGE (ΔG) HELPS PREDICT WHETHER A REACTION WILL OCCUR SPONTANEOUSLY AT CONSTANT TEMPERATURE AND PRESSURE. A NEGATIVE ΔG INDICATES A SPONTANEOUS REACTION, WHILE A POSITIVE ΔG SUGGESTS NON-SPONTANEITY.

HEAT CAPACITY

HEAT CAPACITY IS THE AMOUNT OF HEAT REQUIRED TO CHANGE A SUBSTANCE'S TEMPERATURE BY ONE DEGREE CELSIUS. IT IS AN ESSENTIAL CONCEPT IN THERMODYNAMICS, AS IT INFLUENCES HOW MATERIALS RESPOND TO HEAT INPUT AND CAN BE CLASSIFIED AS SPECIFIC HEAT CAPACITY OR MOLAR HEAT CAPACITY, DEPENDING ON THE CONTEXT.

APPLICATIONS OF THERMODYNAMICS
