## ATOMIC STRUCTURE AND THEORIES

# HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENT OF ATOMIC THEORY

ATOMIC THEORY HAS EVOLVED SIGNIFICANTLY OVER TIME. JOHN DALTON'S EARLY 19TH-CENTURY MODEL PROPOSED THAT MATTER IS COMPOSED OF INDIVISIBLE ATOMS. HOWEVER, THIS IDEA WAS CHALLENGED BY J.J. THOMSON'S DISCOVERY OF THE ELECTRON, LEADING TO THE "PLUM PUDDING" MODEL, WHICH DEPICTED ATOMS AS SPHERES OF POSITIVE CHARGE WITH EMBEDDED ELECTRONS.

ERNEST RUTHERFORD'S GOLD FOIL EXPERIMENT REVEALED THAT ATOMS HAVE A DENSE NUCLEUS, LEADING TO THE NUCLEAR MODEL OF THE ATOM. NIELS BOHR LATER REFINED THIS MODEL BY INTRODUCING QUANTIZED ENERGY LEVELS FOR ELECTRONS. MODERN QUANTUM MECHANICAL MODELS DESCRIBE ELECTRONS IN TERMS OF PROBABILITIES RATHER THAN FIXED ORBITS, PROVIDING A MORE ACCURATE REPRESENTATION OF ATOMIC STRUCTURE.

## SUBATOMIC PARTICLES

ATOMS ARE COMPOSED OF THREE PRIMARY SUBATOMIC PARTICLES: PROTONS, NEUTRONS, AND ELECTRONS. UNDERSTANDING THESE PARTICLES IS ESSENTIAL FOR GRASPING ATOMIC STRUCTURE:

- **PROTONS:** POSITIVELY CHARGED PARTICLES FOUND IN THE NUCLEUS. THE NUMBER OF PROTONS DETERMINES THE ATOMIC NUMBER AND IDENTITY OF AN ELEMENT.
- **NEUTRONS:** NEUTRAL PARTICLES ALSO LOCATED IN THE NUCLEUS. NEUTRONS CONTRIBUTE TO THE ATOMIC MASS BUT DO NOT AFFECT THE CHARGE OF THE ATOM.
- **ELECTRONS:** NEGATIVELY CHARGED PARTICLES THAT ORBIT THE NUCLEUS. THE ARRANGEMENT OF ELECTRONS DETERMINES THE CHEMICAL BEHAVIOR OF AN ATOM.

UNDERSTANDING THE ROLE AND BEHAVIOR OF THESE SUBATOMIC PARTICLES IS VITAL FOR MASTERING THE CONCEPTS OF CHEMICAL BONDING, REACTIONS, AND STOICHIOMETRY IN LATER UNITS.

## THE PERIODIC TABLE: ORGANIZATION AND TRENDS

THE PERIODIC TABLE IS A POWERFUL TOOL THAT ORGANIZES ELEMENTS BASED ON THEIR ATOMIC STRUCTURE AND PROPERTIES. IN UNIT 1, STUDENTS WILL LEARN HOW TO READ AND INTERPRET THE PERIODIC TABLE, AS WELL AS UNDERSTAND THE TRENDS THAT EMERGE WITHIN IT. THE PERIODIC TABLE IS ARRANGED IN A WAY THAT REFLECTS THE PERIODIC LAW, WHICH STATES THAT THE PROPERTIES OF ELEMENTS ARE PERIODIC FUNCTIONS OF THEIR ATOMIC NUMBERS.

## PERIODIC TRENDS

SEVERAL KEY TRENDS CAN BE OBSERVED IN THE PERIODIC TABLE, WHICH ARE ESSENTIAL FOR PREDICTING THE BEHAVIOR OF ELEMENTS:

- **ATOMIC RADIUS:** THE SIZE OF AN ATOM, WHICH GENERALLY DECREASES ACROSS A PERIOD FROM LEFT TO RIGHT AND INCREASES DOWN A GROUP.
- **IONIZATION ENERGY:** THE ENERGY REQUIRED TO REMOVE AN ELECTRON FROM AN ATOM, WHICH INCREASES ACROSS A PERIOD AND DECREASES DOWN A GROUP.
- **ELECTRONEGATIVITY:** A MEASURE OF AN ATOM'S ABILITY TO ATTRACT AND HOLD ONTO ELECTRONS, WHICH ALSO INCREASES ACROSS A PERIOD AND DECREASES DOWN A GROUP.

UNDERSTANDING THESE TRENDS ALLOWS STUDENTS TO MAKE PREDICTIONS ABOUT THE REACTIVITY AND BONDING OF DIFFERENT ELEMENTS, WHICH IS CRUCIAL FOR MASTERING CHEMICAL REACTIONS IN SUBSEQUENT UNITS.

# CHEMICAL MEASUREMENTS AND UNITS

ACCURATE MEASUREMENTS ARE FUNDAMENTAL IN CHEMISTRY, AND UNIT 1 INTRODUCES STUDENTS TO THE CONCEPTS OF SIGNIFICANT FIGURES, SCIENTIFIC NOTATION, AND VARIOUS UNITS OF MEASUREMENT. THESE SKILLS ARE ESSENTIAL FOR CONDUCTING EXPERIMENTS AND ANALYZING DATA.

## SIGNIFICANT FIGURES AND SCIENTIFIC NOTATION

SIGNIFICANT FIGURES ARE USED TO CONVEY THE PRECISION OF MEASUREMENTS. STUDENTS WILL LEARN THE RULES FOR DETERMINING THE NUMBER OF SIGNIFICANT FIGURES IN A GIVEN MEASUREMENT AND HOW TO APPLY THESE RULES IN CALCULATIONS. SCIENTIFIC NOTATION IS ALSO INTRODUCED, ALLOWING FOR THE EXPRESSION OF VERY LARGE OR VERY SMALL NUMBERS IN A CONCISE FORMAT.

## UNITS OF MEASUREMENT

CHEMISTRY RELIES ON VARIOUS UNITS FOR MEASURING QUANTITIES SUCH AS MASS, VOLUME, AND CONCENTRATION. COMMON UNITS INCLUDE:

- **MASS:** MEASURED IN GRAMS (G) OR KILOGRAMS (KG).
- **VOLUME:** MEASURED IN LITERS (L) OR MILLILITERS (ML).
- **CONCENTRATION:** TYPICALLY EXPRESSED IN MOLES PER LITER (M).

UNDERSTANDING THESE UNITS AND HOW TO CONVERT BETWEEN THEM IS VITAL FOR PERFORMING CALCULATIONS IN CHEMISTRY AND ENSURING ACCURACY IN EXPERIMENTAL WORK.

## SIGNIFICANCE OF UNIT 1 IN AP CHEMISTRY
