UNDERSTANDING WATER CONTAMINANTS

THE CHEMISTRY BEHIND FILTRATION METHODS

FILTRATION AND MEMBRANE PROCESSES

TYPES OF WATER FILTRATION SYSTEMS

POINT-OF-USE (POU) SYSTEMS

- **ACTIVATED CARBON FILTERS:** GREAT FOR REMOVING CHLORINE, SEDIMENT, AND VOLATILE ORGANIC COMPOUNDS (VOCs).
- **REVERSE OSMOSIS SYSTEMS:** PROVIDE COMPREHENSIVE FILTRATION, REMOVING A WIDE RANGE OF CONTAMINANTS.

THESE SYSTEMS ARE IDEAL FOR HOUSEHOLD USE AND CAN SIGNIFICANTLY IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF DRINKING WATER.

POINT-OF-ENTRY (POE) SYSTEMS

POINT-OF-ENTRY SYSTEMS FILTER WATER AT THE MAIN SUPPLY LINE, ENSURING ALL WATER ENTERING A HOME IS TREATED. EXAMPLES INCLUDE:

- **WHOLE-HOUSE FILTRATION SYSTEMS:** OFTEN UTILIZE SEDIMENT FILTERS AND ACTIVATED CARBON STAGES.
- **WATER SOFTENERS:** TARGET HARDNESS-CAUSING MINERALS SUCH AS CALCIUM AND MAGNESIUM.

POE SYSTEMS ARE PARTICULARLY BENEFICIAL FOR ADDRESSING ISSUES THAT AFFECT MULTIPLE WATER OUTLETS IN A HOME.

MATERIALS USED IN WATER FILTRATION
