

WHAT ARE CRYSTALS IN CHEMISTRY

DIAMOND, WHICH IS A FORM OF CARBON, IS A CLASSIC EXAMPLE OF A COVALENT CRYSTAL, SHOWCASING EXCEPTIONAL HARDNESS AND THERMAL CONDUCTIVITY.

METALLIC CRYSTALS

METALLIC CRYSTALS ARE CHARACTERIZED BY A LATTICE OF METAL CATIONS SURROUNDED BY A "SEA" OF DELOCALIZED ELECTRONS. THIS STRUCTURE ALLOWS METALS TO CONDUCT ELECTRICITY AND HEAT EFFICIENTLY. CONDUCTIVITY

CONDUCTIVITY VARIES AMONG DIFFERENT TYPES OF CRYSTALS.
