DEFINITION OF AEROSOLS

FORMATION OF AEROSOLS

- **CHEMICAL REACTIONS:** GASEOUS PRECURSORS CAN UNDERGO REACTIONS IN THE ATMOSPHERE, LEADING TO THE FORMATION OF NEW AEROSOL PARTICLES. THIS IS COMMON WITH POLLUTANTS THAT REACT TO FORM SECONDARY AEROSOLS.

THESE PROCESSES ARE INFLUENCED BY ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS, INCLUDING TEMPERATURE, HUMIDITY, AND WIND PATTERNS, WHICH AFFECT AEROSOL STABILITY AND LIFETIME IN THE ATMOSPHERE.

APPLICATIONS OF AEROSOLS
