

WHAT IS NBS IN CHEMISTRY

DEFINITION OF N-BROMOSUCCINIMIDE

IT IS A WHITE TO PALE YELLOW CRYSTALLINE SOLID THAT IS HIGHLY SOLUBLE IN ORGANIC SOLVENTS SUCH AS ACETONE AND CHLOROFORM BUT LESS SOLUBLE IN WATER. NBS IS SYNTHESIZED THROUGH THE REACTION OF SUCCINIMIDE WITH BROMINE, RESULTING IN THE FORMATION OF A STABLE BROMINATING AGENT THAT CAN EFFECTIVELY INTRODUCE BROMINE INTO VARIOUS ORGANIC SUBSTRATES.

THE STRUCTURE OF NBS CONSISTS OF A SUCCINIMIDE BACKBONE WITH A BROMINE ATOM ATTACHED TO THE NITROGEN ATOM. APPLICATIONS OF N-BROMOSUCCINIMIDE
